


## To our 4-H Family,

2014 was a year to remember for Wisconsin 4-H and for your Foundation. The year was capped off with the fabulous Wisconsin Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Gala on November 15th. It was a day everyone was proud to be a part of 4-H. Of course our pride soared when our own Foundation Board Member, John Brunnquell was inducted with the inaugural hall of fame class.

It was also a good year for the Foundation thanks to your continued support of Wisconsin's 4-H Youth. Your generous support allowed us to:

- Increase cash support of statewide 4-H programs to \$160,000 of which \$80,000 is a block grant for our state program director to use where the need is greatest.
- Be a major sponsor of the Centennial Gala which helps keep costs low for honorees and their families.
- Raise over \$150,000 at the Governor's Meat Products Auction at State Fair this August. That was almost double the amount generated the year before.
- The Foundation launched its e-newsletter in November so we can keep you informed of our activities in supporting 4-H Youth. Please let us know if you would like your name added to our email list.

Brenda Scheider, our Director of Development, has been very busy meeting many state and county 4-H stakeholders as we strive to meet the local needs with our dollars.


### BRENDA LOBDELL SCHEIDER DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT
