The clover that symbolizes the four cornerstones of 4-H. The motto that challenges every 4-H member to excel. The pledge that reminds our 4-H youth about their responsibilities to themselves and to others. These principles are the foundation for building the next generation of leaders.



Our youth, fueled by the desire to Make the Best, Better, are our hope for a bright future. The pledge they make now to learn, to persevere and to serve is a guide for the rest of their lives. 4-H provides our youth with opportunities to build character, to learn skills and to become leaders.

4-H Alumna Sarah is just one example of how 4-H makes a real difference for our youth. She shares that when she entered college she noticed that her leadership résumé was nearly double some of her peers. As a ten-year 4-H member she had held nearly every position in her 4-H club; knew how to organize and run a meeting; had chaired committees, and had participated in countless other leadership opportunities.

Due to her 4-H experiences, Sarah was able to hit the ground running. But she knows that leaders aren't born; they are fostered and grown from being the "game leader" as a 12-year-old, who are guided and given more responsibility as they grow. She believes her leadership skills were learned over time as she was given age-appropriate jobs, along with the tools needed to succeed.

Sarah laughs as she shares that when she meets adults who are not familiar with parliamentary procedures, she's sure that most 4-H'ers could teach the basics!

Sarah is living proof that the 4-H pledge is more than words. Perhaps you recited the pledge for the first time in a basement or gymnasium or fellowship hall. Or maybe you are just now learning about the 4-H pledge. In any case, the pledge is a challenge to our youth and it's a road map to success.

Sadly, we know that for many youth, learning and living the 4-H pledge is not possible. It may be transportation or communication or finances. But youth across Wisconsin face barriers to becoming part of the 4-H movement.

It's heartbreaking to think about the young people who aren't connecting with a caring adult who will help them make better decisions. Or the teens who are isolated and lonely without other youth who will help them be part of a community. Or the youth who are struggling and need a place to learn how to be confident, caring and compassionate.
